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WEBELOS WOODS

AN OVERVIEW

WEBELOS WOODS is a learning adventure for both WEBELOS and ARROW of LIGHT SCOUTS. In addition to the benefits of family camping there will also be an opportunity for meeting, greeting and learning from the participants and other families. The program offers the WEBELOS/AOL SCOUTS an opportunity to obtain credits for several WEBELOS/AOL Adventure badges. The event also offers WEBELOS /AOL SCOUTS to interact with BOY SCOUTS from of our District troops.

PARENT PARTICIPATION

Although Webelos Scouting does not require a one-to-one (parent to scout), we are encouraging parents/guardians of Webelos/AOL Scouts to attend this event. You will have the opportunity to speak with Scoutmasters and talk about transitioning from being Cub Scout parents to Boy Scout parents. So, plan to attend.

EVENT REGISTRATION

ONLINE REGISTRATION WILL BEGIN SEPTEMBER 1st, 2019 AND END SEPTEMBER 30th, 2019. Individuals and/or Dens may register online through the Occoneechee Council's website. Access to the link: https://ocscouts.org/event/webelos-woods/?instance_id=3794.

COMPLETE APPENDIX FORM A-1 ONLINE REGISTRATION REPORT, ACTIVITY SELECTION, AND WEEKEND CAMPING PLANS AND SEND TO DIRECTOR.

REGISTRATION FEES will be graduated depending on how early you sign-up. The following registration fees for each, Youth and Adult, will apply as indicated. All children under five years of age are free.

Through September 30, 2019	\$ 10.00 – youth / adult
October 1, 2019 – Day of Event	\$ 15.00 – youth / adult

REGISTRATION CAN BE MADE by family or Den Leader. As such, every attempt will be made to group those scout families from their unit together. You are encouraged to register early.

ALL registered/fee paid youth, Webelos/AOL Scouts and Den Leaders, Boy Scouts and Unit Leaders, will receive a commemorative patch.

DIRECTIONS To Camp Durant / CAMP MAP

See the maps to Camp Durant and at Camp Durant in the appendix at the end of this guide. The schedule notes where events are to be held. We have reserved Loblolly, Persimmon, Dogwood, Holly, Magnolia, Sassafras, and Red Oak campsites. Check-in at Loblolly Shelter.

UPON ARRIVAL

The campsites will be open at 1:00pm on Friday, October 4th. Check in begins at 4:30pm and ends at 7:30pm. If for whatever reason you are going to be arriving later than 7:30pm, please notify the event director by phone (919-971-4404). The check in ending time has been set for safety reasons so that few moving cars will be in the camper area after dark.

PARKING

Upon arrival, participants may drive to a campsite (see the camp map) and unload their gear. When finished move autos to the parking lot adjacent to the Grand Lodge. Then check-in at the Loblolly Shelter. No autos are permitted in the campsites.

SAFETY

Standard IOLS & BALOO training standards for safety will be in effect. To repeat a few of the most important ones:

- 1) NO OPEN FLAMES (Candles, matches, etc.) IN TENTS
- 2) Bring or have access to a first aid kit at ALL times.
- 3) In case of an accident immediately perform all necessary First Aid and notify Headquarters. If the injury is one that, in your opinion, needs an emergency medical response, CALL 911 immediately.
- 4) NO fire should be left unattended if still burning/smoldering.

WEATHER

Yes, weather will be provided. Be Prepared, watch weather projections starting a week in advance!

UNIFORMS

All youth and adult members of BSA should be in proper uniform when appropriate. BSA field uniform should be worn for arrival, flag raisings & retreats, awards ceremonies, and departure.

WHAT TO BRING

Suggested Personal Equipment

1. BSA Health and Medical Form
2. Class A uniform shirt for assemblies.
3. Webelos Book and notepad/or paper, pen or pencil
4. Pack or Cub Scout T-shirt for Saturday activities.
5. Hat. This is a wooded area.
6. A pair of comfortable boots or walking shoes kept tied at all times
7. One pair of extra shoes, in case the first pair gets wet.
8. One change of trousers and shirt.
9. Three pair of socks.
10. Two sets of underwear.
11. Toilet Kit
12. Sweatshirt or light jacket. (Heavier outerwear if weather dictates.)
13. Poncho or raincoat with rain hat or hood. (A MUST)
14. Tent w/groundcloth
15. Sleeping bag or blankets w/pillow.
16. Sleeping mat or air mattress for comfort.
17. Eating utensils: plate, cup, knife, fork, spoon. (A MUST)
18. Flashlight with additional batteries.
19. Lawn chair or camp stool for adults. (You may want to bring some reading materials.)

NOTE: Make sure all your personal equipment is marked with your name.

MEALS

All meals will be “**on your own**” and should be prepared in your campsite. There **may be** restrictions on open flames and fires. Such notices will be posted by the Event Staff.

Meals on Friday should be simple to prepare or be prepared in advance brought from home. Please be mindful of the schedule when planning your meals. Saturday lunch should be quick and easy (sandwiches suggested) due to only an hour for lunch.

Plan to do your cooking on a gas grill or stove. You may want to share those facilities with attending families from your own or other units as appropriate.

EVENT PATCH DESIGN COMPETITION

During the Spring a District wide patch design competition will be held. Details of the competition will be distributed at the District Roundtables and via the District listserv. The Webelos/AoL scout whose design is chosen will be given a framed copy and a prize for his/her efforts.

WEBELOS DEN FLAGS

Each attending Webelos Den is encouraged to bring their Webelos Den flag and carry it with their Den throughout the weekend. Observations will be made by the HQ staff during the event Friday evening and to the Saturday activities. An award will be given to the Den for “best flag at the event”.

FRIDAY NIGHT'S CAMPFIRE

Friday night's campfire will be led by Saponi Chapter of the Order of the Arrow.

DEN LEADERS / PARENTS MEETING

A Den Leaders/Parents Meeting will be held at 9:00pm Friday night at the Scoutcraft Shelter to review Saturday's program and discuss any changes to program and/or event site locations.

WEBELOS PATROL/DEN CAMPSITE EVALUATION

Each Den camping area will be inspected during the daylight hours on Saturday. The purpose of the grading of the campsite is to provide the Den a listing of those things a Boy Scout campsite would be judged on. Dens will receive awards for 1st, 2nd, & 3rd best site.

WEBELOS WOODS SPIRIT AWARD

During the event Dens will be judged for their scout spirit by the HQ staff. The top award for Webelos Woods will be which Den has the best spirit throughout the weekend starting with the campfire Friday night to the recognition ceremony Saturday afternoon.

SATURDAY NIGHT'S CAMPFIRES/CRACKER BARRELS

Saturday night campfires are encouraged to include all participants camping together on a campsite sharing skits, songs, and stories. Cracker Barrels by units in campsites.

SCOUT'S OWN SERVICE

Everyone staying through Sunday is encouraged to attend the “Scout's Own Service” on Sunday morning at 9:00am at the flag pole site. Troop Chaplain Aides will conduct the brief interdenominational service.

UNIT CHECK-OUT PROCEDURES

Saturday Check Out

- A unit representative shall report to HQ to request an inspection.
- Commissioner will be sent to the unit's campsite and final clearance will be made.
- Once cleared, patches and any outstanding documents will be presented to unit.

Sunday Check Out

- Units staying overnight will follow the same procedure as above.

INDIVIDUAL CHECK OUT PROCEDURE

Individuals wishing to check out separate from their units must sign out with both their unit leader and the registrar. As a safety precaution youth will not be released without permission from their unit leader.

GENERAL ACTIVITY PROTOCOLS

Rehearsing or completing any of the requirements listed for the activities below PRIOR to arrival would be of great benefit to your Scout. It would also assist the Activity Cadre in giving them more time to demonstrate the “doing” requirements during each session. Also, be sure that your Scout brings a notepad/or paper and a pencil or pen to take notes. Seven activity sessions are scheduled throughout the day for Webelos/AOL Scouts. NO ELECTRONICS permitted during activity sessions.

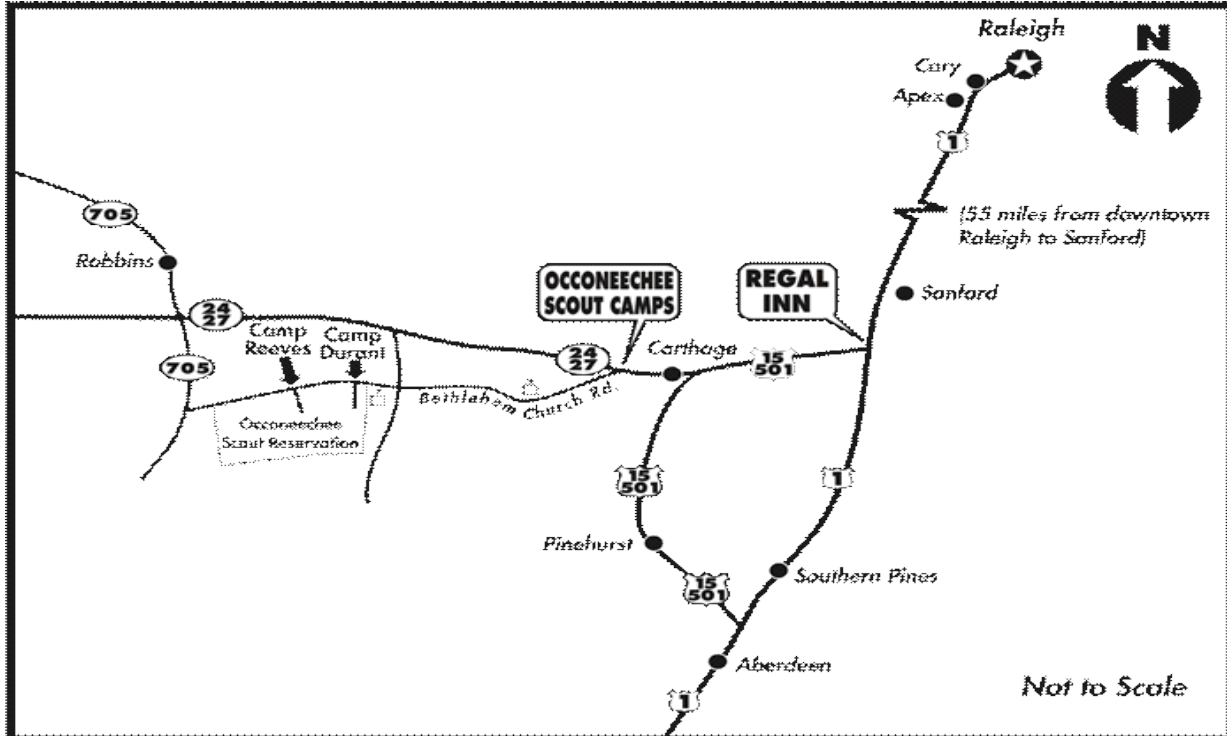

A - 3 DIRECTIONS TO CAMP DURANT



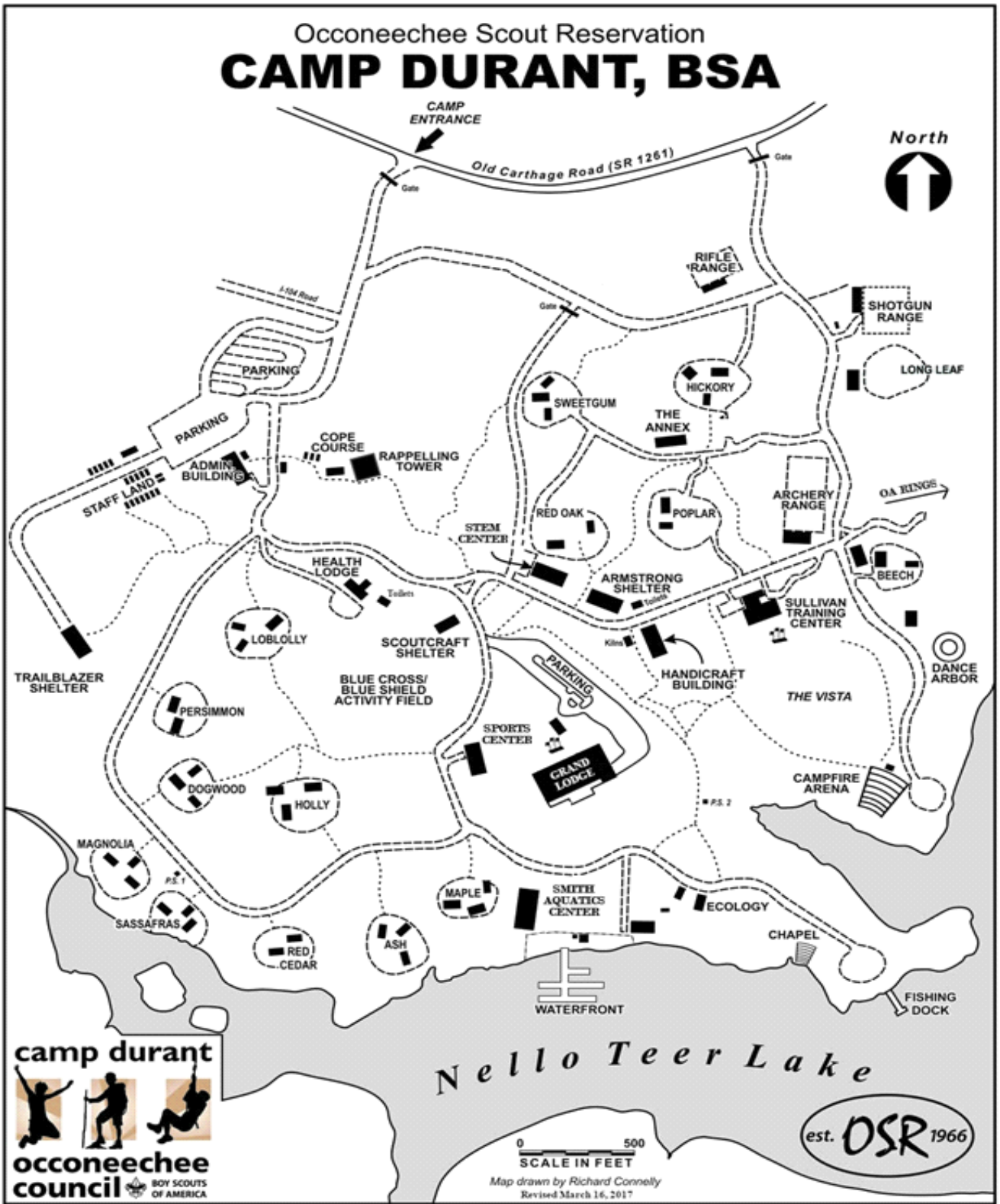
Take US-1 south from Raleigh past Sanford to the US-15/501 exit to Carthage and Pinehurst (you will see the Regal Inn on your right just before you exit to the right). Take US-15/501 South to the outskirts of Carthage where the speed limit drops to 35 mph (enforced!). Where 15/501 veers left and continues to Pinehurst, you will continue to head straight (west) where NC-24/27 peels off into Carthage.

Continue into town until you reach a traffic circle which goes around the town's courthouse. Turn right and go halfway around the traffic circle (as if you had gone straight through the courthouse) and continue on NC-24/27 to the outskirts of town. After you have passed a couple of convenience markets and a graveyard on your right, you will come to a "Y" intersection where you will turn left onto Bethlehem Church Rd. (On your right will be a green highway information sign with "Oconechee Scout Camps" and an arrow pointing the way). What used to be an old gas station will be on your left in the "Y". You will come to a very sharp curve almost immediately after turning ... go slow!

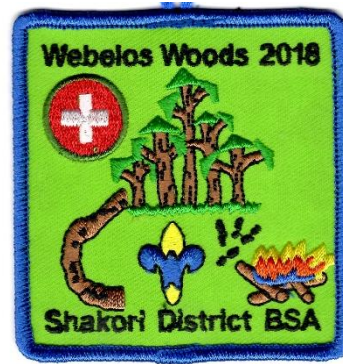
After about 8 miles of twisting country road, you will come to a stop sign. After stopping, go through the intersection for less than a mile. On your left you will pass a brick Methodist church before coming to the service entrance to Camp Durant. The entrance to Durant is about a half-mile further on the left. Park in the parking lot and check in at the adjacent Administration Building. Camp Durant phone: (910) 948-2382; FAX (910) 948-2284.

The Ranger's residence is about a mile-and-a-half further down Bethlehem Church Rd. on the left at the entrance to Camp Reeves. You must to check in with him if the main gate to Durant is locked. Rangers phone: (910) 948-3258; Camp Reeves Administration Building phone: (910) 948-2804.
