

Student Community Service Awards

Boy Scouts of America

The Triangle Nonprofit & Volunteer Leadership Center has been recognizing individuals for their extraordinary community service for more than 40 years. The Center offers Triangle-Area students three award opportunities that will not only recognize and reward their service hours, but just as importantly, will enhance their academic careers and improve their collegiate applications.

The Commissioners Award

This requires 50+ hours of volunteer service completed during the course of the school year. Any hours completed and approved by the Boy Scouts of America will be recognized and approved by the Triangle Nonprofit & Volunteer Leadership Center. Should a Scout achieve 50+ hours of community service during the school year, he should present the TNVLC with the applicable requirements by the Commissioners Award deadline, July 15th, 2016. Upon appropriate completion and delivery, the Scout will receive the Award at the Tomorrow's Community Leaders Ceremony, presented in the fall.

The Mayor's Award

This requires a minimum of 60+ hours of volunteer serviced completed during the summer following school closing and prior to school opening. Three levels are available for the Mayor's Award: Silver (60 - 99 hours), Gold (100 – 149 hours), and Platinum (150+ hours). Any hours completed and approved by the Boy Scouts of America will be recognized and approved by The Triangle Nonprofit & Volunteer Leadership Center. Should a Scout achieve the required hours of community service during the summer, he should present the TNVLC with the applicable requirements by the Mayor's Award deadline, September 2nd, 2016. Upon appropriate completion and delivery, the Scout will be granted a photo with the Mayor and receive the Award at the Tomorrow's Community Leaders Ceremony presented in the fall.

The President's Award

This is the nation's premier volunteer award program and recognizes hours completed over a time period of 12 consecutive months. The Award requires varying amounts of hours, and offers various levels, dependent on the age of the volunteer. There are 4 categories of recipients (Kids: Age 5-10, Teens: 11-15, Young Adults: 16-25, Adults: 26+). There are 4 levels of the award (Bronze, Silver, Gold, and Lifetime). Each award's requirements vary depending on which category the recipient is in. Any hours completed and approved by the Boy Scouts of America will be recognized and approved by The Triangle Nonprofit & Volunteer Leadership Center. Should a Scout achieve the required hours of community service during the 12 consecutive month time period, he should present the TNVLC with the applicable requirements. Should a Scout achieve the required hours of community service, he should present the TNVLC with the applicable requirements by the President's Award deadline, September 2nd, 2016. Upon appropriate completion and delivery, the Scout will be granted a photo with the Mayor and receive the Award at the Tomorrow's Community Leaders Ceremony, presented in the fall.
