What is the University of Scouting

The University of Scouting is a fun-filled, hands-on training event and an opportunity to network with other Scouters. This one-day training event is designed for <u>ALL</u> Cub Scout, Scouts BSA, Sea Scout, and Venturing Leaders.

What you need to know

Participants register for the event and can attend <u>ANY</u> courses in <u>ANY</u> of the colleges that appeal to them. For example, a Cub Scout Leader can attend not only classes in the Cub Scout college but also go to a Scouts BSA or General Studies or a Venturing course. Be sure to look at all the colleges for all the opportunities and topics of interest to you. Our goal is for Scouters to increase their knowledge by experiencing the different areas of the Scouting program.


