A Scout is trustworthy.

- ***Attendance - every youth must be accompanied by an adult.***
- ***Do not bring or encourage others to come, even for the day on Saturday. We have no extra space. This is being respectful to those who registered on time so that everyone can have a mountaintop experience.***
- ***Remember, the Webelos event is only for the Scouts of that rant currently. Parents are encouraged to remain at Camp Durant. Absolutely no siblings at the Webelos event. Any Webelos leader who does accompany the youth will receive lunch there. There will be vegetarian options.***
- ***Every pack needs to bring their tents, personal gear, and be prepared to provide all the meals for the weekend for everyone who is attending Cuboree from their pack. Please be a good neighbor as you will probably be sharing shelters for meal preparation.***

DO NOT BRING FIREARMS, ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES, PETS, OR FIREWORKS.

Vehicles

Parents & Adults are the best role model for our youth.

Remember, A Scout is Trustworthy & Obedient.

- ❖ Personal Vehicles are allowed to drive around Camp Durant all day Friday up until 8 AM on Saturday and after 5 PM on Saturday.
- ❖ For the safety of our scouts, no driving of personal vehicle around Camp Durant between 8am- 5pm on Saturday (EXCEPTION- Emergency Vehicles, Camp Ranger & Exhibitors)
- ❖ ANY CUBOREE PARTICIPANT CAN CHECK IN AS EARLY AS 2 PM ON FRIDAY.

Before you come:

Parents and Adults are the best role models for our youth.

Remember, a Scout is Helpful & Thrifty.

- Pack light. You only need personal clothing and personal hygiene, a sleeping bag, a pillow, a mat, and a tent.

DO NOT BRING SEVERAL ELECTRICAL APPLIANCES. OUR ELECTRICAL CIRCUITS ARE EASILY OVERLOADED. THE PRIMARY PURPOSE OF ELECTRICITY IN THE CAMPSITES IS FOR CPAP MACHINES.

Before you arrive - you should receive a parking pass to be placed on your dash. Your pack Cubmaster or coordinator will have your parking passes. Campsites are assigned by pack so everyone in a pack will be assigned the same campsite. We have 15 campsites with A and B sides and 33 packs coming. You will NOT have a campsite just for your pack.

UPON ARRIVAL -

Each car will receive a camp map, emergency protocol, and a weekend schedule of all activities. You will be directed to the campsite where your pack and other packs will set up camp. REMEMBER, YOU WILL BE SHARING CAMPING SPACE WITH MANY OTHER HAPPY CUB SCOUT FAMILIES.

Every pack will have a check in packet at the Cuboree Admin which is located in the STEM building. ONLY ONE PERSON NEEDS TO COME TO GET IT.

The check-in packet will include shooting sports schedule for Cubs, wristbands for CUBS and Webelos, and patrol assignments for Webelos.

● Campsite

Parents & Adults are the best role model for our youth.

***Remember a Scout is Kind, Friendly, Courteous, and Cheerful
PARK PERPENDICULAR TO CAMP ROADS, NOT PARALLEL SO THAT
THERE IS SPACE FOR ALL VEHICLES.***

- ❖ Be a good neighbor! Each campsite will have multiple Cub Scout Packs. The site must be shared.
- ❖ Parking is limited at each site.
- ❖ When parking, ensure emergency vehicles can pass through camp for the safety of all attending.
- ❖ Some campsites are smaller than others. Plan to share space so all tents can fit and our youth can have a fun time!
- ❖ There are two dining shelters at each campsite. The dining shelter is for everyone! Share with the other packs and other families at your campsite.

- ❖ Youth are excited making sleeping Friday night difficult. Saturday will be a busy day and they will sleep on Saturday. Thankfully :)
- ❖ Be a good campsite neighbor and make new friends.
- ❖ Please refrain from roping off your camping area. **DO NOT** bring an axe, hatchet or chain saw to this event. Tent camping only, no campers or RV's will be allowed in the camp.
- ❖ Remember - parents set a good example - be patient with all the excited youth and **NO BAD LANGUAGE, PLEASE**
- ❖ Please be sure to bring carrying containers for water. Use of gas stoves and charcoal should follow BSA policies and guidelines. Bring your own **TRASH BAGS!**
- ❖ Radios, boom boxes, two-way radios, guns, fireworks, sheath knives, **PETS**, and alcoholic beverages are not allowed. Fireworks and firearms are prohibited. All BSA and Occoneechee Council camp policies must be followed. Camp Durant policies can be found at www.ocscouts.org .
- ❖ Make sure all campfires are out before retiring for the night and before you check out on Sunday. A fire check will be made and you will be awakened to extinguish the fire if no one is tending it. *****DUE TO DRY CONDITIONS IT IS POSSIBLE THAT CAMPFIRES WILL NOT BE PERMITTER. WE WILL LET YOU KNOW THAT WEEKEND.**
- ❖ Be prepared for the cool and/or wet weather.
- ❖ Each campsite has showers, flush toilets, potable water sources, and dining area with picnic tables.
- ❖ **DO NOT ALTER ANY BARRIERS AT THE CAMPSITES.**
- ❖ **LEAVE YOUR CAMPSITE BETTER THAN WHEN YOU ARRIVED.**

Activities

- *There will be an information meeting at Armstrong shelter at 8 PM on Friday evening to answer questions for any adult.*
- ***There are close to 150 Webelos Scouts, including girls. The Webelos will be divided into troops. Each troop will begin their Scout BSA day on Saturday by meeting at the flagpole in front of the Grand Lodge. Information on which troop your Webelos are in will be in the check-in packet. The troops will begin their day at staggered times . BE SURE THEY HAVE A WATER BOTTLE. Their Scout BSA day will fill most of their day on Saturday. The Webelos will create their own lunches for themselves and the accompanying adults under the guidance of Chef Eddie Wilson. The troops will leave their Scout BSA day at staggered times. This should guarantee that all the Webelos will be reunited with their families and other members of their packs allowing plenty of time for***

clean-up and preparation for dinner. The Webelos will then be at Camp Durant for the remainder of the Cuboree. Please contact Karen Goldstein at klgoldst@yahoo.com or text 317-445-1140 (preferred) if you have any questions.

- *Shooting sports (sling shots at Camp Durant for Lions, Tigers, Wolves, and Bears, and archery for Webelos are the only scheduled activities. Bouldering and the climbing wall tickets will be distributed via lottery on Friday evening. All other activities are available at your whim.*
- **Tickets for the climbing wall will be distributed using a lottery system. Each pack will submit their pack number at the Admin building along with the number of Cubs who wish to experience the climbing wall. EACH PACK CAN REQUEST NO MORE THAN 5 TICKETS FOR THE CLIMBING WALL. EVERY YOUTH MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY AN ADULT. Bouldering will not require a ticket but will require an adult accompany each child.**
- **SIBLINGS ARE NOT PERMITTED AT THE WEBELOS EVENT, NOR CAN THEY PARTICIPATE IN SHOOTING SPORTS. THEY CAN PARTICIPATE IN EVERYTHING ELSE.**
- *Activities at Camp Durant include Ga Ga ball, human foosball, crafts, map and compass, suma- wrestling, gem mining, rope maze, monkey bridge, and knots. These activities will be available from 9-noon and 1:30-4:30.*
- **Hike our trails, and, if you find a treasure box, you may take one prize. "A Scout is trustworthy."**
- **YOU MAY BRING YOUR OWN FISHING GEAR AND FISH IN DESIGNATED AREAS. THERE IS TO BE NO FISHING AT THE DOCKS BEHIND THE GRAND LODGE AS THIS WOULD CAUSE A POTENTIAL DANGER FOR SWIMMERS DURING SUMMER CAMP.**
- **There will be no waterfront activities as the staff necessary to make water activities safe is not available during Cuboree.**
- **Bring frisbees and play our 18-hole disc golf course.**

Allen Hastings, along with other trained Scouters are providing the climbing wall and bouldering activities for the Cubs (not Webelos). The climbing wall is a ticketed event. Only ten Cubs are able to participate at the climbing wall activity at one time. EACH CUB MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY A PARENT AS THE PARENT WILL FUNCTION AS THE SPOTTER. Tickets will be distributed via a lottery system. Please submit your pack number at the Admin building (STEM) along with the number of youth who want to try the climbing wall (no more than 5 per pack). Ten tickets will be available for each of the following times - 9 AM, 10 AM, 11 AM, 1:30 PM, 2:30 PM, and 3:30 PM. Be sure to check your shooting sport time so you don't conflict or overlap. Bouldering is not a ticketed event but does require a parent accompany each child.

THERE WILL BE MORE ACTIVITIES THAN YOU HAVE TIME TO EXPERIENCE. LET YOUR CUB SCOUT INDICATE WHAT PEAKS THEIR INTEREST. MAPS WILL INDICATE THE LOCATION OF ALL ACTIVITIES

And don't forget the Camp Durant trading post and grill which is located on the lower level of the Grand Lodge!

This year we are providing two quiet rooms for those youth and adults who are easily over-stimulated with activities and sound. One will be the Beluga room on the lower level of the Grand Lodge next to the trading port and one is the classroom at Sullivan which is nearest the road. There will be signs. Quiet activities will be provided.

HOW DO I GET TO CAMP DURANT?

- **Directions to Camp Durant - From Exit 56 on NC-540 which connects to US 1-S, drive south for 31 miles. After you have driven through Sanford, take the exit on your right onto US-15S/US-501S, towards Carthage. Drive 10.6 miles. Keep right on NC-24/NC-27 for 1.2 miles. In the center of Carthage is a round-about around the courthouse. Take the second right and travel to the west side of Carthage. Once you see the Cross Hill Cemetery on your right, look ahead and there is a Y intersection and a building with a blue roof. Take the left fork onto Bethlehem Road and travel 7 miles. You will come to a stop sign intersection. Continue on this road for about half a mile. There will be signs indicating "Camp Durant." The entrance to camp is on the left; The physical address for Camp Durant is 4637 Old Carthage Road.**

Check-in/check-out:

- **A pack roster is to be presented at Admin upon arrival. Be sure you have a health history form for every person camping with your pack. If you forgery the pack roster forms will be provided . This makes it possible for us to know who is at camp if we need to find someone in an emergency. Health forms**

are to be kept with your pack. There is a full-time doctor at the health lodge all weekend.

- Check-out can occur on Sunday after 10 AM AFTER your campsite has been inspected by staff volunteers.
- All trash must be deposited in the trash containers prior to leaving campsite.

Emergency Contact:

- The camp telephone number may be used to contact persons in an emergency. (910) 948-3258.
- Staff volunteers will attempt to contact unit leaders to relay emergency information,
- Should you need to contact a Scout or leader at the Cuboree, we need the following information:
 - The nature of the emergency
 - The name of the Scout or Leader to be located
 - Their unit number
 - The name of their unit leader at the Cuboree.
 - The person the Scout or Leader is to contact.
 - The telephone number for the Scout or Leader to call. Permission to place a collect call to this number should also be given.
 - If unable to contact the camp, you should contact the Moore County Sheriff's Department (910) 947-293

What to wear:

- Activity uniforms (pack t-shirts, other Scouting t-shirts) .

First Aid:

- Every person (Cub Scout, adult, siblings, staff) MUST have a current and complete BSA health history form on file with his or her unit. Bring these with you to camp. (The form is included with this event guide.)
- Each unit should have its own First Aid kit.
- There will be a doctor at the health lodge 24 hours a day. Please have your BSA health history form on hand.
- If transport to a medical facility is required, health history form MUST accompany the patient.

Lost and Found:

- Lost and found items should be returned to the Cuboree Admin at the STEM building.

Safety:

- Normal safety precautions should be taken at all times. Please remember:
 - no riding in truck beds or trailers (open or enclosed)
 - no fireworks
 - no sheath knives
 - no liquid fuels or open flames in tents
 - no pets
 - no alcoholic beverages
 - no boom boxes, radios or two-way radios
 - Youth Protection policies should be followed regarding camping.
 - Buddy system should be used at all times.
 - no firearms, law enforcement please check in with Event Registrar at Sullivan Center upon arrival.

CUBOREE GUIDELINES

- Upon arriving at Camp Durant, park your vehicle near your campsite area following the directions of the parking volunteer staff.
- Send one adult leader to check in your unit at the Cuboree Admin. The Pack must provide a list of all attendees including adults and siblings. We will need a current roster of everyone attending for the weekend.
- Each campsite will be hosted by district personnel to assist with camp set-up. They will assist you in locating the assigned campsite for your pack.
- Set-up your campsite (Note: Due to an expected large turnout, more than one Pack will be assigned to each campsite. Please be courteous to your neighbors.)
- Please follow the direction of all volunteer Staff & Traffic Coordinators. This will facilitate your check in and getting to your campsite.
- BALOO leadership is required for each Pack that will be family camping, in accordance with the Guide to Safe Scouting and BSA policies.
